IN THE NEWS

The 31st Annual Vermont Book, Postcard, and Ephemera Fair, presented by the Vermont Antiquarian Booksellers Association, will take place on Sunday, June 1st, 10-4, at St. Albans City Hall. Michelle and Eileen will be there!

For emerging writers only, the Masters Review Short Story Award offers online publications and a \$3000 grand prize for a story up to 6000 words in length. Deadline is August 2025; entry fee \$20. See https://mastersreview.com/short-story-award-for-new-writers/.

The Lorian Hemingway Short Story Competition (named for Ernest Hemingway's granddaughter) offers a first prize of \$1500 for a story of up to 3500 words. Deadline is September 2025; entry fee is \$15. See https://shortstorycompetition.com/.

The Zoetrope Short Fiction Contest offers a first-place prize of \$1000 and publication for a story of up to 5000 words. Contest opens on July 1; deadline is October 1, 2025; entry fee is \$30 per story. See https://www.all-story.com/zoetrope-all-story-short-fiction-competition/.

Still up and running: Townsend Press is offering 20 prizes of \$1000 and (possible) publication for an essay of 2500 words or more on the writer's "personal religion" – his/her belief system about their role and purpose in the world. The Event magazine 2025 Creative Non-Fiction Contest is open for submissions through October 15, 2025. Entries must not have been previously published and have a 5000-word limit. There's a \$34.95 entry fee. See https://www.eventmagazine.ca/contest-nf/.

On the other hand, annotated book lists are always fun, even when you have no intention of ever ever reading Balzac. Included is a helpful checklist.

A Swim in a Pond in the Rain

George Saunders. Random House, 2022.

By the author of Lincoln in the Bardo, essays about what makes stories work, based on examples from classic Russian short stories. A great interactive read as the author continually breaks into the text to ask questions of the reader.
